HOTEL UPDATE

The transition of the Conference hotel to DoubleTree by Hilton Manchester Downtown is complete. A very limited number of rooms are still available. The Hilton Garden Inn has standard king (1 king bed) or standard double (2 queen beds) rooms available on Thursday & Friday, April 4th & 5th, 2019 at a rate of \$164.00 per night, plus tax. All rooms have a hospitality area with a microwave, refrigerator and Kuerig coffee makers. Parking is complimentary, and Wi-Fi is available throughout the hotel and guest rooms. The bus trip takes 22 minutes down Elm St. to Veterans Park near the Conference location. La Quinta's Conference room block is only being held until March 12, 2019.

A WORD FROM THE HOSPITALITY COMMITTEE

The Hospitality Committee is getting ready to welcome you to Manchester! We'll be there to help you find local restaurants, banks or ATMs, and other amenities while at the conference. In the meantime, in this issue we feature some of the art museums and galleries Manchester has to offer.

1. Currier Museum of Art

This premier art museum contains American and European paintings. The museum began in 1915 with a gift from the estate of Hannah Currier, the widow of the New Hampshire Governor Moody Currier. It opened in 1929, before the Museum of Modern Art in New York and the National Gallery of Art in Washington, D.C.

The architecture of the original building portrayed the Italian Renaissance style and featured mosaics by Salvatore Lascari which are now protected by a courtyard. American artists include Georgia O'Keeffe, Winslow Homer, Edward Hopper, Frank Stella, Andrew Wyeth; European artists include Henri Matisse, Claude Monet, Pablo Picasso.

A special exhibit from March through June 2019 will be beadwork from Ubuhle women.

2. Zimmerman House

Frank Lloyd Wright designed this house in 1950 for the Zimmerman family. It is the only Frank Lloyd Wright house in New England that is opened to the public.

PRECONFERENCE OPPORTUNITIES

Wednesday, April 3 is technically the day before the Conference, but since we have the whole building for the whole day, why not take advantage of the space? Well, we are! We have an entire day of special events planned for 'the day before'! These optional activities include a bus tour of genealogical research sites (see the information below) and Librarians Day (featured in E-zine 3), there will be stand-alone workshops you can attend for a fee but without having to pay for a Conference registration as well as Special Tracks for DNA and Tech (featured in E-zine 4), Professionals, and Societies – as well as NERGC's first Military Day. Wednesday's preconference activities conclude with a reception at the Millyard Museum.

MILITARY DAY: NERGC's first Military Day with David Allen Lambert, sponsored by the New England Historic Genealogic Society will provide the opportunity for genealogists to focus on military topics that might not otherwise be included in a general conference for broad audiences. The day will include a series of lectures covering Colonial Conflicts, Revolutionary War, War of 1812, Civil War, World War I, and World War II. Cost is \$50 and includes the DNA Matching Technology luncheon with Daniel Horowitz.

RESEARCH OVERVIEW—BUS TOUR

On Wednesday, April 3, 2019, a Research Overview Bus Tour will be provided for all who are interested in learning about several genealogical research sites in southern New Hampshire. The Tour will depart the Conference hotel at 10:00 a.m. and return by 3:00 p.m. and will include the American-Canadian Genealogical Society, the Manchester Historical Association, a tour or a description of the Manchester City Library, the New Hampshire Historical Society Library in Concord, and the New Hampshire State Library in Concord. Participants will then be able to return on their own to carry out individual research. The cost for the Tour is \$35 per person, and our stop for lunch in Concord will be "Dutch-treat". WEDNESDAY EVENING RECEPTION: THE MILLYARD MUSEUM

Join us at 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday for an informative and entertaining evening at the Millyard Museum. The Museum was opened in 2001 by the Manchester Historic Association in one of the renovated mill buildings of the Amoskeag Manufacturing Company at the corner of Commercial and Pleasant Streets, which include the permanent exhibit Women in Time, 11,000 Years at Amoskeag Falls, that tells the story of Manchester from the time of the earliest settlement to the present time. The reception will include light refreshments and the opportunity to tour the museum's exhibits. Cost is \$15 per person.

BE AN EXHIBITOR!
